A new Tawhai LSC is currently being appointed.

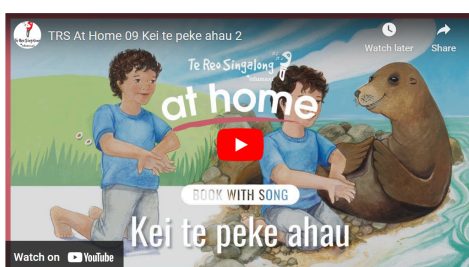
